**ORGANIZATION AND  
ESTABLISHMENT – CANADIAN  
CADET ORGANIZATIONS AND  
CADET ORGANIZATIONS  
ADMINISTRATION AND TRAINING  
SERVICE**

**PURPOSE**

1. This order is applicable to the Canadian Cadet Organizations (CCO) and to the Cadet Organization Administration and Training Service (COATS), a sub-component of the Reserve Force. It amplifies QR(Cadets), Vice Chief of the Defence Staff (VCDS) Group Order 2004-1 and Canadian Forces Military Personnel (CF Mil Pers) 20/04, Administrative Policy of Class “A”, Class “B” and Class “C” Reserve Service. Policy and procedures on organizations and establishments are set out in A-AE-219-001/AG-001 (CFP 219-1), Canadian Forces Organization and Establishment Policy and Procedures. This CATO is effective on receipt.

**ORGANIZATIONS**

**Canadian Cadet Organizations**

2. In accordance with Section 46 of the National Defence Act, cadets are organized into four organizations: Sea, Army and Air Cadets and Junior Canadian Rangers.

3. Cadet corps/squadrons authorized under QR(Cadets) shall be included in the appropriate cadet organization and shall be subject to the authority and command of cadet instructors and other officers from time to time carrying out duties and responsibilities in respect of cadet organizations, as may be prescribed in orders and instructions issued by the Chief of Defence Staff.

**OBJET**

1. Cette ordonnance s’applique aux Organisations de cadets du Canada (OCC) et au Service d’administration et d’instruction des Organisations de cadets (SAIOC) qui est un sous-élément de la Réserve. Elle amplifie les OR (Cadets), l’Ordonnance 2004-1 du groupe du Vice-chef d’état-major de la Défense (VCEMD) et l’Instruction 20/04 du Chef – Personnel militaire des Forces canadiennes (CPM FC) intitulée Politique administrative pour le service de réserve de classe « A », de classe « B » et de classe « C ». La politique et les procédures qui s’appliquent aux organisations et aux effectifs sont énoncées dans le document A-AE-219-001/AG-001 (PFC 219-1), Organisation des Forces canadiennes et politique sur les effectifs. Cette OAIC entre en vigueur sur réception.

**ORGANISATIONS**

**Organisations de cadets du Canada**

2. Conformément à l’article 46 de la *Loi sur la défense nationale*, les cadets sont répartis en quatre organisations : les cadets de la Marine, les cadets de l’Armée, les cadets de l’Air et les Rangers juniors canadiens.

3. Les corps/escadrons de cadets autorisés en vertu des OR (Cadets) doivent faire partie de l’organisation de cadets appropriée et être placés sous l’autorité et le commandement d’instructeurs de cadets et, parfois, d’autres officiers assumant des fonctions et des responsabilités à l’égard de l’organisation, conformément aux ordonnances et aux instructions du Chef d’état-major de la Défense.
